SUMMARY OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROCESS:

WRATS TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM: FY 2018 - FY 2021

Introduction

The Warner Robins Area Transportation Study (WRATS) is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for transportation planning purposes within the Warner Robins urbanized area. The WRATS study area includes the cities of Byron, Centerville, Perry and Warner Robins. Houston County, northern Peach County and Robins Air Force Base are also included. Under federal law, the Warner Robins Area Transportation Study must develop a long-range plan and short-term program for transportation improvements within this area through a cooperative process involving the local governments and the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT).

The short-term program, known as the WRATS Transportation Improvement Program: FY 2018-2021 (TIP), indicates the Warner Robins urbanized area's transportation priorities for a four year period, and demonstrates how the area will apply federal, state, local and private financial resources to implement these projects. In order to be eligible for any level of federal funding, a project must be in the WRATS Long Range Transportation Plan and the TIP.

The TIP lists street and highway construction projects by the federal funding categories. The TIP projects are those, which have been authorized and allocated for the State's construction work program, according to the proposed scheduling and phasing for FY 2018-2021.

Public Notice/Review Period Guidelines

Public Review Process:

A key element of the process to develop a TIP is public involvement. The public was invited to review and submit comments on the WRATS Transportation Improvement Program: FY 2018-2021. Copies of the document were available at the following locations from May 1 through May 30, 2017: Warner Robins City Hall Annex, Houston County Annex, Centerville City Hall, Perry City Hall, and Byron City Hall. A copy of the TIP was also located on the WRATS website at <http://www.wrga.gov/index.aspx?NID=297>.

Amendment Process:

If the Policy Committee determines that the final plan or program differs significantly from the one which was made available for public comment, and raises new material issues which interested parties could not reasonably have foreseen from the public involvement efforts, an additional 15 days for public comment on the revised plan or program shall be made available. If the Policy Committee determines it necessary to amend the final plan or program, the Policy Committee may approve the proposed amendment(s) subject to a 15-day public review and comment period. If no significant comments are received, the amendment(s) will stand as approved with no further action. If comments are received which the MPO staff considers as potentially significant, the comments will be presented to the Policy Committee for consideration and appropriate action.

Notice

Notice of the FY 2018-2021 TIP public comment period was placed in the Houston Home Journal newspaper on April 26, 2017. A copy of the public notice is attached to this document for reference purposes.

An article about the three bridge projects in the TIP was published on May 9, 2017 in the Macon Telegraph. A copy of that article is also attached.

Summary of Comments and Responses

No comments from the public were received on the TIP.

Copies will be made on a first-come, First-served basis. Files are available for review and copying 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday, excluding holidays.

You are hereby notified of the opportunity to submit written public comments concerning the draft Title V Air Quality Operating Permit. Persons wishing to comment on the draft Title V Operating Permit are required to submit their comments, in writing, to EPD at the above Atlanta Air Protection Branch address. Comments must be received by the EPD no later than 30 days after the date of which this notice is published in the newspaper. (Should the comment period end on a weekend or holiday, comments will be accepted up until the next working day.) The Division, in making its final decision to issue the Title V permit, will consider all comments received on or prior to that date.

Any requests for a public hearing must be made within the 30-day public comment period. A request for a hearing should be in writing and should specify, in as much detail as possible, the air quality related issues that constitute the basis for the request. Where possible, the individual making the request should also identify the portion(s) of the Georgia Rules for Air Quality Control and/or the Federal Rules that the individual making the request is concerned may not have been adequately incorporated into the draft permit. If a public hearing on the draft Title V Operating Permit is to be held, the date, time, and location of the hearing will be provided in a subsequent, separate notice. At that hearing, anyone may present data, make a statement or comment, or offer a viewpoint or argument either orally or in writing concerning the draft Title V permit. During the Division's decision-making procedures to use the Title V permit, any information received during a public hearing will be considered together with information received during the comment period.

Following this 30 day public comment period, the draft permit will undergo a 45 day review by U.S. EPA in accordance with 40 CFR 70.8. Information pertaining to U.S. EPA's review period can be found on their website at <http://www.epa.gov/caa-permitting/georgia-proposed-title-v-permits>.

After the comment period has expired, the EPD will consider all comments, make any necessary changes, and issue the Title V Operating Permit. Copies of the final Title V Operating Permit, comments received, EPD's responses to comments, and any other relevant information will then be made available for public review during normal business hours at the office of the Air Protection Branch. A summary of comments and any changes made to the final permit will be found in an addendum to the narrative. A copy of this narrative and the final Title V permit will be added to the information already available at the Internet address given above.



Three Houston bridges scheduled for replacement

Three bridges on busy roads in Houston County are slated for replacement, but two of those projects won't happen for a while.

The bridges are in the Transportation Improvement Program document that is currently open for public review. Inclusion in the plan means the projects are approved to get done, said Jessica Bird, transportation planner for Warner Robins.

The bridges are not in Warner Robins but Bird is the lead agent of the Warner Robins Area Transportation Study, which not actually a “study” but the designation for the transportation planning area. The area includes all of Houston County and all of Byron in Peach County. The area also includes Robins Air Force Base.

The Transportation Improvement Program includes replacement of bridges on Ga. 247 south of Kathleen, Courtney Hodges Boulevard in Perry and U.S. 41 at Flat Creek.

The Ga. 247 project is slated to start sometime in fiscal 2018, which begins July 1. The bridge is at Big Indian Creek and the design calls for traffic to use a temporary bridge on the western side, according to an email from Kimberly Larson, spokeswoman for the Georgia Department of Transportation.

Construction of the other two bridges is scheduled for 2022, and the designs haven’t been done so traffic plans for those have not been set. The DOT prefers complete closure because that incurs the least cost, Larson said, but she added that “with good reason” on-site detours will be considered for those two bridges as well.

Courtney Hodges Boulevard is a major thoroughfare in Perry connecting downtown to the Georgia National Fairgrounds and Agricenter. Chad McMurrin, lead engineering technician for the city of Perry, said complete closure of the Courtney Hodges bridge, which is also at Big Indian Creek, would be a major traffic issue for the city. He said there is no good traffic alternative and the city has requested that the DOT put in a temporary bridge while the new bridge is constructed. Design for that project is slated for fiscal 2018 and a public hearing will be held.

The Transportation Improvement Program specifies projects to be completed over the next four fiscal years. The document is available for review and public comment through May. It can be seen at the Warner Robins City Hall annex, the Houston County annex, Centerville City Hall, Byron City Hall and Perry City Hall. It can also be viewed at www.wrga.gov/index.aspx?NID=297.
